ROBIN D. DUNN(Resignation in Lieu of Disciplinary Proceedings)

On October 9, 2024, the Idaho Supreme Court entered an Order accepting the resignation in lieu of disciplinary proceedings of Rigby attorney Robin D. Dunn. The Idaho Supreme Court's Order followed a stipulated resolution of a disciplinary proceeding that related to the following conduct.

Between 2022 and 2023, Mr. Dunn conspired with two clients and others to traffic methamphetamine and fentanyl. In November 2022, Mr. Dunn caused fentanyl to be distributed to a client who was incarcerated in a county jail. On September 14, 2023, Mr. Dunn was indicted and charged in the U.S. District Court for the District of Idaho with four felony counts related to that conduct. On July 18, 2024, Mr. Dunn pleaded guilty under a Rule 11 Plea Agreement to one count of conspiracy to distribute fentanyl and methamphetamine, with a recommended 42-month term of imprisonment.

In the resulting disciplinary case, Mr. Dunn admitted that he engaged in a concurrent conflict of interest in violation of I.R.P.C. 1.7(a)(2) and committed a criminal act that reflected adversely on his fitness as a lawyer in violation of I.R.P.C. 8.4(b).

The Idaho Supreme Court accepted Mr. Dunn's resignation in lieu of disciplinary proceedings. By the terms of the Order, Mr. Dunn may not apply for admission to the Idaho State Bar sooner than five (5) years from the date of his resignation. If he does apply for admission after five (5) years, he will be required to comply with all the bar admission requirements in Section II of the Idaho Bar Commission Rules and shall have the burden of overcoming the rebuttable presumption of the "unfitness to practice law."

By the terms of the Idaho Supreme Court's Order, Mr. Dunn's name was stricken from the records of the Idaho Supreme Court and his right to practice law before the courts in the State of Idaho was terminated on October 9, 2024.
